





## What we've done so far

Over the past year, the Florida Southeast Connection team has been busy conducting a number of wetland, listed species, cultural and civil surveys over the proposed pipeline corridor route. These surveys have provided the details necessary to finalize a proposed route that results in the least impacts possible to landowners and the environment.

In addition, Florida Southeast Connection has hosted open houses throughout the region to share information and hear from the community. Our team members welcomed the opportunity to engage with you and provide more information about the proposed pipeline route during our open house events during the fall of 2013 in Kenansville, Haines City, Lake Wales, Indiantown, Fort Pierce and Okeechobee.

The Federal Energy Regulatory
Commission (FERC) then held a series
of scoping meetings this spring in
counties along the proposed pipeline
route to receive public input on the
Florida Southeast Connection pipeline.
Florida Southeast Connection

to questions from stakeholders

## **Recent activity**

On Sept. 26, 2014, Florida Southeast Connection, LLC, filed its application with FERC for a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to construct, own and operate new interstate natural gas pipeline facilities and transport natural gas in interstate commerce. FERC issued a new docket number for the project, CP14-554.

The application contains a description of the proposed project including maps of the proposed pipeline route, rates and tariff, construction methods, schedules and environmental reports providing information related to the impact of the pipeline on the environment and community. A list of statutory and regulatory requirements, such as additional authorizations required from other agencies, is also included in the application.

## What are the next steps?

Upon receiving an application, FERC issues a public Notice of Application for authorization to construct and operate a new pipeline in the Federal Register and begins the application review process.

As the permitting process continues, FERC will be holding additional public meetings to solicit project input from stakeholders like you. These meetings will likely be held in the spring of 2015. Look for additional details on these meetings — including dates and locations — in the coming months.
